We are called to live in this promise of no longer, but not yet.

This year the month of March is in the heart of our Lenten journey. Throughout this month and these 40 days we are invited to refocus on how God is calling us to be present and live each day. Rev. Dr. Charlene Rachuy Cox encourages us saying, "Lent is a time amid this unfinished life in which we are

invited into experiences of reset and renewal, trusting that God is with us to help us to imagine again and anew how we live into God's call in daily life." During the next month we will explore God's call through our Sunday morning worships, Wednesday Lenten services, and spiritual practices throughout the week. I hope you can join us in-person or online and I hope you feel more connected to the Divine presence within you and around you.

May we hear God's call in this present moment.


