"Worship and Epiphanies"

It is every pastor's dream: To be a part of an epiphany! No, I'm not talking about pastors dreaming about getting a call to serve at one of the thirty ELCA congregations named "Epiphany Lutheran Church" or "Lutheran Church



of the Epiphany." But, instead, to be a part of helping someone to see and to know Jesus Christ. That is a wonderful thing to be a part of! And it's not something that only pastors get to be a part of. Every Christian has this privilege and responsibility - to help in the revelation of God's Son to the world. That's an "epiphany."

I have been mindful of this privilege and responsibility many times in my work, but I am especially mindful of this task and joy when it's time to preach. Whether the members of the congregation that particular day of worship are hearing the "old, old story" or hearing the Gospel (Good News) message for the very first time, I have the privilege of helping folks to see Jesus Christ. It is an awesome and humbling calling.

I hope that you regularly put yourself in times and places to be "epiphanized." I know that it helps my faith and, in fact, my entire outlook on life when I regularly "see" Jesus. But if I stay away from opportunities to do so - like times of worship - chances are that I will not see Jesus. Or I won't see Jesus as I should.

I can't identify many "blessings" that came out of our struggles with the COVID pandemic, but there is one that has become very obvious to me: the boundaries of many a congregation's worship services have now been extended beyond their sanctuary walls. Many congregations have gone online and

livestreamed their worship services - as has this congregation of St. Paul in Sterling. I have found that having these livestreamed and recorded worship services available have helped a lot of people to hear God's Word and have proven to be a tremendous worship and outreach opportunity. So, while there is no question in my mind that that it is best to gather together to worship the Lord - as Scripture calls us to do - I am grateful that when we are unable to gather with others, we can still be "epiphanized" by God's Word reaching us via the internet.

In a past issue of "The Lutheran" magazine, Pastor Peter Marty doesn't write about epiphanies, but his words about worship in a faith community are really wonderful. Here's the closing paragraph of his article: "If we stay away from worship too long, we start to make God into our own image. The privatization of our spiritual journey only transforms God to be virtually anything we want. Once back in the habit and flow of worship, however, and surrounded by a mix of people who don't mirror every facet of our life, something delightful happens. We discover God to be quietly remaking us into God's own image. We encounter a rhythm stronger than our heartbeat. We find ourselves full of more joy than we can contain."


You know what? I think these words do have something to do with an epiphany!




