"Set Aside Holy Time"

We "set aside" time for different things. Why else would we bother to enter or jot things down in our calendars or make notes to ourselves that are stuck on the refrigerator door? We want to make sure that we don't forget that we have "set aside" such-and-such time for this activity or that appointment.



Within the month of April this year, there is a week that that has been "set aside" by Christians for centuries. It is "Holy Week" - a week that includes Palm and Passion Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and leads into Easter Sunday. "Holy Week" is a fitting name, because the word "holy" has its roots in the thought of something being "separated" or "set aside" for God's purposes. Holy Week is a time that has been "set aside" for worship of the Lord as we hear the story of God's loving purpose in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is a Holy week. (Please make note of the opportunities to worship during Holy Week here at St. Paul and also with our sisters and brothers at St. John in Sterling and Immanuel in Rock Falls.)

As we think about this upcoming holy - "set aside" - week, I ask that you also hear, once again, God's commandment that states: "Remember the Sabbath Day, and keep it holy." It is important that we "set aside" time in our lives and our calendars for that which is truly important - to recognize and treat certain times and actions as "holy." As we get set for a holy week, let's remember the holy day of each week - a day in which we come together to worship the Lord. In doing so, we'll be reminded that each and every day is a day that is set aside

for God's purpose. And, as followers of Jesus Christ, I pray that our lives reflect that truth.

Yes, I know that some of you have very little control over a job that has you working during the "set aside" days and times of worship. (Believe me, I understand; my whole career consisted of "working" weekends!) I hope that you make a special effort to find ways to declare some times each week as "holy." Times of Scripture and devotional reading and prayer are important for everybody; and they are especially important if one can't gather together with other Christians on a weekly basis. (And what a blessing it is to have St. Paul's worship services available on St. Paul's website. Sunday mornings don't work? You can "join us" each and every week at another time of the week by simply clicking on that week's worship service!) Also, as you are working at that Sunday morning job, how about taking some time to think about the ministry that you may be (or could be) doing for others?

The words "remember" and "holy" will be important words during this month. Remember God's loving purpose in Jesus Christ during the Holy Week that has been specifically set aside for remembering and worship. But also keep those words, "remember" and "holy", in your weekly thoughts throughout the year as you think through and plan your calendar.

"Remember the Sabbath Day, and keep it holy."


