

"Communion Age Reflections"

Over a good many of my years of service as a pastor, I many times heard the following kind of questions from children in regards to the Lord's Supper: "Can I have some, too?" "When will I get to do this?" "Why can't I have Jesus, too?" And for many years I by-passed many a not-yet-communing child with an outstretched hand - and



then saw a puzzled and/or hurt look as they turned their face up to their parent.

For a good many years I was somewhat satisfied to pat a head and whisper something like, "Your time will come." But then, over the years, I felt more and more "convicted" every time I passed by a child who gave some indication that they desired to receive the food and drink of the Sacrament with everybody else. And so, passing them by, became an increasingly painful thing to do. And, in doing so, it did not feel like I was doing a Christ-like thing.

So, let me share a very truncated version of how I came to act or "share" differently. Turning to the Scriptures, we see that there is no mention at all as to what age or grade in school one need be before partaking of Holy Communion. What Scripture does say in regards to a "who and how" question about the Lord's Supper is: "Examine yourselves, and only then eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For all who eat and drink without discerning the body, eat and drink judgment against themselves." (1 Corinthians 11:28-29) These words certainly give us reason to see that the Lord's Supper is to be taken seriously.

Taken out of context these words seem to say that one had better be able to recognize and understand that it is Christ's body that we are receiving

and eating in the Lord's Supper. If this is the case, then it appears that a certain level of rather sophisticated mental ability would be needed. To tell you the truth, I truly doubt that my "mental abilities" were in this place when I received my first Communion as an eighth-grader. In fact, there are times in these days that I'm pretty sure that I'm not there!

Thankfully, read in context, these verses come across quite differently. Paul, in this portion of his first letter to the Corinthians, is writing about those involved in the Lord's Supper having some kind of understanding that <u>they</u>, as a part of the congregation, <u>are the body of Christ together</u>. (Paul was very upset that members of the church in Corinth were not treating one another as members of the body of Christ; and this "mistreatment" was evident in the way that they came together for the Lord's Supper.)

Do some of our young children have some kind of understanding that the worshipping community they are gathered together with is "the body of Christ"? I have to admit that sometimes I think that children can and do feel and understand this more so than many of us adults. And Jesus' numerous references to us needing to be like children in order to see and to be a part of the Kingdom of God may bear witness to this. (Along with this, the other Sacrament of the Church - Holy Baptism, is what makes_us a part of the Body of Christ.)

So, after checking with a child's parent or guardian, I no longer "pass by" a child with an outstretched hand. And, along with this, understanding that every child of God needs to grow in their faith and understanding of the teaching and work and love of the Lord, I have tried to offer opportunities for the children of a congregation to learn and grow in their "understanding" of the Lord's Supper. (This is done with the understanding that not even the teaching pastor can fully understand it!)

Accordingly, I plan to offer some opportunities for learning about the Sacrament of Holy Communion here at St. Paul sometime this fall. These will be targeted towards both those already communing and those not yet communing, but possibly interested. So, watch for announcements and possible mailings.

Northern IL Synod 2025 Focus



The experience of God's love in one's life is a gift the growing disciple feels compelled to share with others. One way our faith becomes active is when we put into words what God has done for us. Words of witness and acts of genuine hospitality directed toward our neighbors create the opportunity through which the Holy Spirit brings others into a relationship with Christ and with the church.

When you hear the word "serve," what comes to mind? Do you think of someone bringing you food at a restaurant? Or do you think about a person who wiped your brow or brought you soup when you were sick in bed?

Christ-centered service is often transformational. It can change both the life of the one who serves as well as the person who is served. Service is a living witness to our faith that provides opportunities for us to invite other to learn more about Jesus. Through service, we encourage those who are struggling to go on and restore hope in their lives. Jesus says, "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back." (Luke 6:38)

Scripture frequently remind us that, as Christians, we are to serve others, work for justice and live in community with our neighbors.

Serving is a multidimensional mark of discipleship and includes direct services, advocacy, and community organizing.

Direct services provide goods and services that benefit those in need. Advocacy involves congregations and communities working together on behalf of the disenfranchised. Community organizing efforts work to achieve justice in society.

As you think about the three prongs of serving, identify those in your community who might be disenfranchised. What new opportunities do you see for serving in your congregation and community?

When we invest time, energy, and resources to address systemic societal issues, we encourage others just as they encourage us. With God's help, we can serve by developing long-range programs and continually training up new leaders who will bring new energy and ideas. We, too, can work "...to proclaim release to

the captives...to let the oppressed go free..." as we build the kingdom of God.




Tri Church Birthday Buddy Update and Fall Bowling Party
