# **DECEMBER 2025**

"Advent: A Season of Preparations"

We nearing the beginning of the church liturgical season of Advent. Advent takes place during the course of the four weeks before Christmas. Within the church, the Christmas season "officially" begins on Christmas Eve. Advent is an important season for us because it is a season of preparations.



We are called to (1) prepare for the coming celebration of the birth of the Christ Child, (2) prepare for the coming again of our Lord - whenever that may be, and (3) prepare for the Lord's coming into our heart and life each and every day.

But as I've thought about some of the instances where my ministry has crossed paths with the lives of God's people over the course of the years, I've realized that there are an awful lot of things going on in the lives of the members of Christ's Church that are very difficult, if not impossible, to prepare for.

- How does one prepare for walking into the office, or the plant, or the shop and receiving word that one's job is no longer there for them?
- How does one prepare for that word from the doctor that the lab reports are not what they were hoping to see?
- How does one prepare for that phone call in the middle of the night with the voice of a stranger at the other end of the line that asks if you are the parent of so-and-so?

 How do you prepare for that which is so unexpected, so unwanted, and so devastating?

I don't have an easy answer to any of these questions. There are obviously things that we can prepare for. The Christmas season? Maybe you are getting ready to address cards, decorate a tree, teaching our children and working on the children's Christmas story presentation, baking cookies, buying gifts and/or designating gifts to something like ELCA World Hunger, etc. But what about the "impossible-to-prepare-for" events of our lives?

How about this? Yes, it's true that a primary Advent message is "Be prepared"; but let's never forget that our Advent and Christmas preparations are always based on the fact that God has cared enough for us that God has already taken care of the ultimate preparations.

We can not prepare for all that life will throw at us. But thanks be to God, God has come into our world as one of us - the Word incarnate, God in-the-flesh - to be born as one of us, live as one of us, die as one of us, and then rise to new life as one of us - for us.

Will this change the message of that pink slip, or lab report, or phone call in the middle of the night? No, I'm afraid not. But I pray that you will know that God came into this world as a baby in Bethlehem in order to fully walk with you in - and through - the tough times of your life. God is prepared to do that with you right now. And I believe that God is doing that with you right now.

As you work at your Advent and Christmas season preparations this month, may you know that you do so only because God has already made all the necessary preparations for this season of your life. And if you are thrown into a life-circumstance that you weren't prepared for, may you know that the Lord is Immanuel - "God with you".

"No eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him." (First Corinthians 2:9)





#### Tri Church Corner: Cledy's House of Hope

As a God's Work Our Hands project for Tri Church, there is much to learn about Cledy's House of Hope, a sober living facility for women in Rock Falls. In the October newsletter, information was provided on who can live at

Cledy's and for how long, along with the process for getting into Cledy's House of Hope. This month, information on the basics of living at Cledy's House of Hope is shared.

#### Describe the inside of Cledy's House of Hope.

• Formerly Rock Falls Rehabilitation Nursing Home, Cledy's is a 42-bed facility offering 15 fully furnished studio style units shared by two residents. In addition, there are six single bedroom units. The facility includes a communal kitchen, a laundry room and a gathering space. There is also a transition unit where women live upon arrival and until a room assignment is made.

#### What is the program structure at Cledy's House of Hope?

• Every resident begins at level one with stricter rules and requirements - for example, early curfews, no overnight stays outside the facility and daily reflections to help establish accountability. With consistent positive behavior, up-to-date house dues and abiding by all the rules and requirements, residents can advance through the remaining levels. By doing so, this gives the residents later curfews, overnight passes, and fewer required support meetings. By level four, residents earn the most independence while still taking part in drug testing, meetings, and regular check-ins with staff.

#### How much does it cost to live at Cledy's House of Hope?

• Residency costs \$150 per week for levels 1 and 2 and \$175 per week for levels 3 and 4. This cost includes all utilities, internet and garbage removal services, with residents supplying their own groceries. Levels 1 and 2 are occupied in a studio style apartment while levels 3 and 4 are upgraded to a 1-bedroom apartment each occupied with 2 residents.
