"Some New Year Hymn Reflections"

One of the things that Nancy I regularly do at the end of each day is to read from a devotional book or a portion of Scripture as we call it a day. We have also read songs and hymns in worship books and church hymnals. I highly recommend using hymns for devotional reading. We have



found that there is a difference in reading the words of a hymn out loud, as opposed to singing those words. For one thing, the phrasing of the reading may be different from the phrasing of the song - where you need to match the words with a particular rhythm. But reading a hymn out loud can also enable one to pay more attention to the words and their message when one doesn't have to be reading musical notes or concentrating on a melody. I truly believe that the worship books and hymnals of the church are some of our greatest devotional resources.

So, as we begin a new year together, let me share a bit from our red worship book, "Evangelical Lutheran Worship" (ELW). According to my ELW hymn concordance, there are a number of hymns that contain the word "year." Let's see if I can string some of these together to form a devotional newsletter article as we start a new year together.

I know that the season of Advent is past - a season that always goes too fast for me. But not surprisingly there are a few Advent hymns that contain the word "year." (Advent is the first season of the church liturgical year.) One of the verses we sang out together on December 14th was: "People, look east. The time is near of the crowning of the year. Make your house fair as you are able, trim the hearth and set the table. People, look east, and sing today - Love, the

Guest, is on the way." I encourage you to hear the words of this hymn call out to you to prepare to meet the Lord when he comes. And when does he come? According to Jesus, Christ is present in every person who needs us and our help. Be prepared to help!

Moving on to the Christmas celebration, here are the words of the fourteenth verse of Martin Luther's "From Heaven Above." "Glory to God in highest heaven, who unto us the Son has given.' With angels sing in pious mirth a glad new year to all the earth." There's a lot in these few words, but I ask you to hear the encouragement to sing out in "pious mirth." What a delightful phrase! To sing out in "devout laughter" and "religious fun."

As the new year begins on January first, and the Christmas season draws to a close on January sixth, the beginning of the season of Epiphany, let's hear this verse from "The Bells of Christmas": "The bells of Christmas chime once more; the heavenly guest is at the door. He comes to earthly dwellings still with new year gifts of peace. Good will." May you know these gifts within your household. And may you and I share them!

And I found two verses that lift up "hope" as we begin this new year - or as you live life in whatever setting you currently know. First, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a Lutheran pastor who stood up against Adolph Hitler, who was imprisoned, and then executed on the personal order of Hitler himself just before Bonhoeffer's camp was liberated, could pen some wonderful words of hope - as he does in "By Gracious Powers." This is how he concludes his poem: "By gracious powers so faithfully protected, so quietly, so wonderfully near, we live each day in hope, with you beside us, and go with you through every coming year."

May we also sing out with Isaac Watts as we look ahead to this year and to all those that will follow: "O God, our help in ages past, our hope for years to come, still be our guard while troubles last and our eternal home."

God's peace be with you and yours in this new year!




